

1. Statutes, General Terms and Conditions

1.1 STATUTES OF THE EUROPEAN MINIGOLFSPORT FEDERATION (EMF) (SA)

The European Minigolf sport Federation was founded at 20.08.2000 in Riga / Latvia as a non registered organisation.

Part 1: GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Art.1: Name, registered office and principles

- 1.1 The Association takes the name of ***European Minigolf sport Federation (EMF)***, is the umbrella organisation of all male and female minigolf players, and is established for an unlimited time.
- 1.2 Members of the EMF are national minigolf federations or also associations if no national federation exists. In individual cases sport organisations may also be accepted following a prior inspection.
- 1.3 Legal seat of the EMF is in Basel, Switzerland.
- 1.4 The EMF acknowledges the statutes and the terms of the World Minigolf-sport Federation (WMF).
- 1.5 All wordings in these statutes refer to persons of either sex. In the following no distinction is made between the sexes for the exclusive purpose of better legibility.
- 1.6 The EMF advocates the principle of the free and voluntary practice and community of the sport.
- 1.7 The EMF is completely neutral with regards to politics, race, and religious faith.
- 1.8 The EMF acts directly and exclusively for charitable purposes.
- 1.9 All EMF organs and officials are volunteers. Travel costs and expenses are reimbursed according to the expense regulations.

Art.2: Purpose

The EMF has the following purpose:

To boost minigolf sport throughout Europe and to adopt the necessary measures to reach this goal. It is not profit-oriented.

Art.3: Activities (non-material means)

The purpose stated in Art. 2 shall be reached through the following activities:

- 3.1** Representation of the interests of its members before the authorities, the other sport federations, the media and the public on a European level.
- 3.2** Boost the europewide competition activities amongst all minigolf players and the organisation of minigolf tournaments, in particular European championships, nations' cups and other all-european competitions for all sport categories.
- 3.3** Monitor compliance with the existing sport regulations.
- 3.4** Fight doping with all means standing to requirement, to accept the WADA-Code and the doping rules of WMF together with its members and to stand up for the fact that any use of doping substances and thus the use of forbidden, performance-increasing means of any kind in the sport is prevented.
- 3.5** PR and advertising for minigolf sport through contact with all media, promotion of the public presence of the sport and initiation and organisation of broadcasts on TV, radio and internet.
- 3.6** The representation of the interests of EMF and its members towards the World Minigolfsport Federation. It has to be guaranteed, that the active members may further represent their own interests directly towards WMF, because they are also members in WMF.
- 3.7** Establish rules for practising and organizing the sport activities within the EMF.
- 3.8** The establishment and execution of terms for the licensing of sport courses and equipment.
- 3.9** The elementary and advanced education of referees and the organisation of seminars to guarantee a uniform interpretation of the rules.
- 3.10** The nomination of continental selection teams.
- 3.11** Promote community work within the EMF in cooperation with the members.

- 3.12 Publication of notices and messages to the media as well as separate news editions.
- 3.13 Expert opinions on minigolf sport and co-operation with all the specific bodies of the all European and international sport.
- 3.14 Boost the foundation of and advertising for new active members in cooperation with the active EMF members.

Art.4: Funding

EMF shall raise the funds to comply with its tasks among others as follows:

- 4.1 membership contributions
- 4.2 profits from events
- 4.3 sponsors, ads, licences, advertising
- 4.4 financial and material donations
- 4.5 fees
- 4.6 module schemes
- 4.7 flea markets and basars
- 4.8 sale of goods (sale of sport and merchandising items, buffets at events)
- 4.9 subsidies
- 4.10 lessons and courses
- 4.11 proceeds from interest and equities
- 4.12 heritages, bequests, and donations
- 4.13 profits from broadcasting rights on TV and radio.

Part 2: MEMBERSHIP

Art. 5: Membership

The EMF has the following types of members:

- 5.1 Active members (national federations / sport organisations / associations if no national federation exists as yet in the respective country)
- 5.2 Honorary members
- 5.3 Supporting members

Art. 6: Conditions for the acceptance for active members

- 6.1** Only one active member per nation can acquire membership.
- 6.2** The acceptance of active members is based on a written, legally binding, signed application to the Executive Committee to which the federation's statutes are attached.
- If no national minigolf federation exists yet, the situation needs to be explained and the association or sports organisation is to be accepted for a limited period of 4 years. Thereafter the situation must be verified periodically by the Executive Committee and submitted to the Delegates' Assembly for a final decision.
- After the application documents have been examined the federation is preliminarily accepted by the Executive Committee subject to a formal decision by the next Delegates' Assembly.
- 6.3** Upon access active members accept and acknowledge the statutes and regulations of EMF as well as WMF.
- 6.4** The active members accepted into the EMF shall pay the fees, dues, and duties determined by the Delegates' Assembly inside the payment terms.
- 6.5** The active members shall be members of the World Minigolfsport Federation or shall at least have submitted an application for acceptance to the World Minigolfsport Federation.
- 6.6** Complaints against a refusal to accept a candidate or an imposed sanction may be brought within 60 (sixty) days from the notification before the Legal Committee subject to the Legal Order.

Art. 7: End of the membership of an active member

- 7.1** Membership of an active member expires by virtue of withdrawal, expulsion, or dissolution of the active member, as well as if its membership in WMF is expired.
- 7.2** The withdrawal of an active member must have been decided by its supreme organ and the information must be submitted to the President subject to a period of notice of 3 (three) months by serving the minutes as a registered letter.
- The duty to pay the membership fee shall only expire at the end of the current calendar year.

- 7.3** If an active member infringes the interests of the EMF, violates its reputation internally or externally, or shows disrespect for or violates the statutes or the regulations, the Executive Committee has the right to impose sanctions against the respective active member.

The Delegates' Assembly shall have the final vote on an expulsion.

Art. 8: Honorary and supporting members

- 8.1** Upon proposal by the Executive Committees the Delegates' Assembly may appoint a honorary status to physical persons who have earned merits for the European minigolf sport. An honorary member has the right to speak in the Delegates' Assembly.
- 8.2** The Delegates' Assembly may accept supporters and sponsors to the EMF by proposal of the Executing Committee. Supporting members have VIP-status at the events of EMF and they may do proposals for all organs.
- 8.3** Honorary and supporting membership may be rejected by the Delegates' Assembly.

Art. 9: Rights and duties of the members

Rights:

- 9.1.** Unless the statutes provide differently in the individual case the EMF members pursuant to Art. 5.1 shall enjoy the rights resulting from the membership in the Federation
- 9.2** to a specialist, legal, and economic representation of interest which is to be verified and determined in the individual case by the Federation's organs.
- 9.3** to representing all common interests of the active members before authorities, institutions, and public and private bodies;
- 9.4** to participate in the Delegates' Assembly and submit motions to all the organs of EMF;
- 9.5** to participate in EMF events, in particular in championships, training camps, and other types of education subject to the terms, guidelines, and tenders to be determined by the EMF;
- 9.6** to information on joint regulations, measures, and procedures;

- 9.7** to participate in elections and votes subject to the respective terms of the statutes and the resolutions of the EMF and of its organs in the Delegates' Assemblies.

Duties:

- 9.8** All members according to the Art. 5.1 must acknowledge without exceptions the statutes of EMF and WMF as well as the decisions taken by EMF and its organs so far these are not against the statutes and to fulfill the duties consequent of these statutes and decisions
- 9.9** All goals and principles of the EMF are binding for all members according to the Art. 5.1
- 9.10** Active members, who do not fulfill their financial or other duties towards EMF, may be punished by the Executive Committee according to the Law and Punishment Regulations established by the Delegates' Assembly. Should a member have unpaid membership fees, other fees or payments older than 10 (ten) months, its membership rights are laid down until the open payments have been completely paid.
- 9.11** Demands may be claimed and they are to be paid to the address of the Finance Manager.
- 9.12** The active members are obliged to immediately submit a list of the elected executive committee members to the EMF. The changes in the statutes are to be submitted to the EMF as well.

Part 3: ORGANISATIONS

1. THE DELEGATES' ASSEMBLY

Art. 10: Competences and tasks

- 10.1** The Delegates' Assembly is the supreme organ of the EMF and shall vote on questions and issues of fundamental importance in European minigolf sport whenever these are not reserved to the active members. The Delegates' Assembly shall determine the guidelines for the management of the Federation.
- 10.2** The competences of the Delegates' Assembly shall include as follows:
- 10.2.1** Election of the member of the Executive Committee.
- 10.2.2** Election of the members of the Technical Committee, of the Youth Committee, of the Education Committee, of the Marketing and Development Committee, of the Juridical Committee, and of the Supervisory Organ.

- 10.2.3** Approval of the annual accounts and of the draft budgets.
- 10.2.4** Approval of the work of the Executive Committee members.
- 10.2.5** Determination of the membership fees and of the tournament fees.
- 10.2.6** Vote on the establishment or on the dissolution of special committees.
- 10.2.7** Vote on the existing motions by the active members, of the Executive Committee, the Technical Committee, or any other committee and the members of the Supervisory Organ.
- 10.2.8** Issue, modify, and lift orders
- 10.2.9** Modifications to the statutes
- 10.2.10** Final acceptance of members
- 10.2.11** Expulsion of members
- 10.2.12** Dissolution of the Federation
- 10.2.13** Awarding of the championships
Active members leave their applications to the Executive Committee, Technical Committee or Youth Committee (in case of youth competitions) according to the set application criteria. These organs forward their opinions to the Delegates' Assembly. The applicant can represent its application to the Delegates' Assembly. The Assembly takes the final decision on the awarding under consideration of previously mentioned opinions and simultaneously with awarding it gives the marketing rights to the organizer (restrictions through existing contracts of EMF are to be mentioned concretely at the awarding).
- 10.2.14** The EMF has in principle the right to make contracts on television and radio broadcasts with the broadcast companies and to deal the profits from these contracts. Previous is also valid for other means of broadcasting picture or voice. The negotiations needed are carried by the Media Manager, if the task is not forwarded to the organizing national federation. The contracts are to be signed by the representatives of the EMF. The incomes from such contracts are dealt equally between EMF and the organizing federation.

Art. 11: Composition and voting rights

11.1 The Delegates' Assembly is composed of:

11.1.1 the delegates of the active members (with voting right)

11.1.2 the members of the Executive Committees (no voting right)

11.1.3 the chairmen of the committees (no voting right)

11.1.4 the honorary members (no voting right).

11.2 Voting right general

11.2.1 Active members with up to 300 (licensed) tournament players have 2 (two) votes. Active members with more than 300 (licensed) tournament players and up to 2500 (licensed) tournament players have 3 (three) votes. Active members with more than 2500 (licensed) tournament players have 4 (four) votes. The votes are not transferable. Decisive for the number of members is the announcement for the running year.

11.2.2 A delegate can exercise all voting rights of the active member.

11.3 Proof of the voting rights

The voting right must be confirmed in writing by the respective active member.

Art. 12: Quorum and decision-taking

12.1 The duly called Delegates' Assembly shall have a quorum in any case.

12.2 A simple majority of votes shall apply to votes and decisions in the Delegates' Assembly with the exception of the cases listed in the statutes.

12.3 A parity of votes qualifies as a rejection.

12.4 Minutes

12.4.1 Minutes shall be drawn up on the resolutions of the Delegates' Assembly which is to be signed by the members of the Executive Committee with competence for the minutes and by the Secretary and must be served on all members no later than 60 (sixty) days after the meeting.

- 12.4.2** The minutes shall qualify as approved unless objections from at least 25 % of votes present at the Delegates' Assembly including written reasons are claimed within 60 (sixty) days from its dispatch. All objections made shall be dealt with at the next meeting. Until such time only those items of the minutes shall qualify as approved against which no objections have been raised.

Art. 13: Ordinary and extraordinary Delegates' Assembly

- 13.1** The ordinary Delegates' Assembly takes place every two years.
- 13.2** The Executive Committee, the members of the Supervisory Organ or at least **1/10** (one tenth) of the active members can affect or demand the convening of an extraordinary Delegates' Assembly.

Art. 14: Convening

- 14.1** The ordinary Delegates' Assembly shall be convened by a written notification to all members and the announcement of the agenda at least 90 (ninety) days before the scheduled date. The competent Executive Committee member shall be responsible for convening the Assembly, the venue and date may be set at a later time.
- 14.2** The term for the convening of an extraordinary Delegates' Assembly may be cut to a minimum of 30 (thirty) days.

Art. 15: Motions

- 15.1** Motions to the Delegates' Assembly may be submitted by:
- 15.1.1** The active members
 - 15.1.2** The Executive Committee
 - 15.1.3** The Technical Committee and all other committees
 - 15.1.4** The members of the Supervisory Organ
- 15.2** The motions must be submitted in writing with arguments at least 60 (sixty) days before the convened Delegates' Assembly to the Secretary General. The Secretary General shall provide all members with a list of the motions at least 30 (thirty days) before the Assembly. Motions brought late are subject to the urgency procedure and may be included on the agenda only with the approval by 2/3 (two thirds) of the votes present.

- 15.3** In the event of an extraordinarily convened Delegates' Assembly the term for the submission of motions shall be cut down to 14 (fourteen) days.

2. THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Art. 16: Composition and tasks

- 16.1** The Executive Committee is composed of:

- 16.1.1 The President**
- 16.1.2 The Secretary General**
- 16.1.3 The Finance Manager**
- 16.1.4 The Sport Director**
- 16.1.5 The Media Manager**

- 16.2** The executive committee drafts a program of tasks and functions gives it to the active members, chairmen of the committees and the Supervisory Organ at their disposal.

Art. 17: Election and period of office

The members of the Executive Committees are elected by the ordinary Delegates' Assembly for one office term of 2 (two) years and can be re-elected without restrictions. Only members of active members can be elected as members of the Executive Committee.

Art. 18: Quorum and convening

- 18.1** The Executive Committee meets whenever there is a need or if requested to meet by at least 3 (three) members.
- 18.2** A quorum shall exist in the Executive Committee whenever three members are present.
- 18.3** The minimum period of notice for convening a meeting shall be 30 (thirty) days.

- 18.4** Minutes shall be drafted on the decisions of the Executive Committee and signed by the member of the Executive Committee responsible for the minutes and the chairman of the meeting. Such minutes must be served on all members of the Executive Committee, active members, chairmen of the committees and members of the Supervisory Organ no later than 60 (sixty) days after the meeting of the Executive Committee.
- 18.5** The minutes shall qualify as approved unless objections from at least 2 members of the Executive Committee including written reasons are claimed within 60 (sixty) days from its dispatch. All objections made shall be dealt with at the next meeting. Until such time only those items of the minutes shall qualify as approved against which no objections have been raised.

Art. 19: Competences and tasks

- 19.1** The competences and tasks to be transferred to the Executive Committee include as follows:
- 19.1.1** The management of the federation.
 - 19.1.2** The management of all budget and cash transactions.
 - 19.1.3** The establishment of periodical reports and accounts.
 - 19.1.4** The preparation of the Delegates' Assembly and establishment of the agenda.
 - 19.1.5** The execution of all decisions taken by the Delegates' Assembly.
 - 19.1.6** Preliminary acceptance of active members.
 - 19.1.7** The internal and external safeguarding of the interests of the federation.
 - 19.1.8** The creation of the budget plan.
 - 19.1.9** The imposition of temporary and permanent bans on competition in the event of infringements against the doping ban.

19.2 Responsibilities and juridical liability

19.2.1 The Executive Committee presents a program of functions and tasks including rights to represent the federation and submits it to active members, chairmen of the committees and the Supervisory Organ immediately to their disposal.

19.2.2 The President, the Secretary General and the Finance Manager are authorized to represent the federation outwards in all juridical procedures, whereas always two signatures of these three are necessary.

3. THE TECHNICAL COMMITTEE

Art. 20: Composition

The Technical Committee is composed of:

20.1 The Sport Director (Chairman)

20.2 The Youth Officer

20.3 The Senior Players Officer

Art. 21: Competences and tasks

21.1 The Technical Committee can independently take effective decisions on competitions organised by the EMF.

21.2 In addition, the following competences and tasks have been transferred to the Technical Committee:

21.2.1 Consultation on general issues of the Europe wide international minigolf sport and sport regulations.

21.2.2 The technical monitoring of all championships and other tournaments organised by the EMF.

21.2.3 The definition of application criteria for all the competitions organized by EMF and the evaluation of applications to be forwarded to the Delegates' Assembly.

Art. 22: Convening, quorum, motions

- 22.1** The Technical Committee holds its meeting twice a year.
- The Technical Committee in addition may only convene subject to the President's approval, unless it needs to discuss especially important issues that cannot be delayed.
- 22.2** The Technical Committee is convened by the Sport Director in analogous application of Art. 14.
- 22.3** A quorum exists in the Technical Committee if two members are present. Each member has a personal vote that cannot be transferred.
- 22.4** Motions to the Technical Committee can be brought by:
- 22.4.1** The active members
 - 22.4.2** The Executive Committee
 - 22.4.3** The committees
 - 22.4.4** The members of the Technical Committee
- 22.5** Minutes shall be drafted on the decisions of the Technical Committee, to be signed by the person responsible for the minutes and the chairman of the meeting and served on all of its members, the Executive Committee, the chairmen of the committees, the Supervisory Organ and the active members no later than 60 (sixty) days after the vote.
- 22.6** Executive Committee and the members of the committee have the right to raise objections against decisions by the Technical Committee within 60 (sixty) days of the dispatch of the minutes of the meeting. In this case the issue needs to be re-discussed at the next meeting of the Technical Committee and in the next Delegates' Assembly. Art. 12.4.2 applies analogously.

4. THE YOUTH COMMITTEE

Art. 23: Composition

The Youth Committee is composed of:

- 23.1** The Youth Officer (CHAIRMAN)
- 23.2** And another 3 (three) members who must not be members of the Executive Committee.

- 23.3** The 4 (four) members of the Youth Committee are elected by the orderly Delegates' Assembly for one term of 2 (two) years and can be re-elected without limitations. They must not come from the same active member federation.

Art. 24: Competence and tasks:

- 24.1** Consultation of the youth-specific issues of the EMF.
- 24.2** The technical supervision of the youth competitions organised by the EMF.
- 24.3** The consultation and vote on all necessary technical sport issues required for the functional progress of the youth competitions states in 24.2.
- 24.4** The definition of application criteria for all the youth championships organized by EMF and the valuation of of the applications to be forwarded to the Delegates' Assembly.
- 24.5** The Youth Committee submits its recommendations and proposals in motions to the Technical Committee, to the Executive Committee and/or to the Delegates' Conference as well as to the Youth Manager of WMF.
- 24.6** The Youth Committee convenes annually and is convened analogously to the Art. 14 through the Youth Officer.
- 24.7** A quorum exists in the Youth Committee if at least 2 (two) members are present.
- 24.8** Minutes shall be drafted on the decisions by the Youth Committee, to be signed by the person responsible for the minutes and the chairman of the meeting and served on all Youth Committee members, the Executive Committee, the chairmen of the committees, the Supervisory Organ and the active members no later than 60 (sixty) days from the vote. Art. 22.6 applies analogously.

5. THE SENIOR PLAYERS OFFICER

Art. 25: Composition

- 25.1** The Senior Players Officer is elected at the orderly Delegates' Assembly for a period of 2 (two) years. He can be re-elected without restrictions.

Art. 26: Competences and tasks

- 26.1** The consultation of EMF on senior player specific questions.
- 26.2** The technical monitoring of the senior players competitions organised by the EMF.
- 26.3** The consultation and vote on all required issue of importance for sport required for the functional progress of the senior players competitions named in 26.2.
- 26.4** The definition of application criteria for all the senior championships organized by EMF and the evaluation of of the applications to be forwarded to the Delegates' Assembly.
- 26.5** The Senior Players Officer submits his recommendations and proposals to the Technical Committee, to the Executive Committee and/or to the Delegates' Conference.

6. THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Art. 27: Composition

The Education Committee is composed of:

- 27.1** The Sport Director (Chairman)
- 27.2** And another 2 (two) members who must not be members of the Executive Committee
- 27.3** The 3 (three) members of the Education Committee are elected at the orderly Delegates' Assembly for a period of 2 (two) years. They must not belong with the same active members, but can be re-elected without restrictions.

Art. 28: Competences and tasks

- 28.1** Securing the rules in sports activities of each active member of the EMF by controlling the activities and offering education.
- 28.2** Co-ordinating the transfer of education material for the trainer education in active member nations.
- 28.3** The Senior Players' Committee convenes annually and is convened analogously to the Art. 14 through the Sports Manager.

- 28.4** A quorum exists in the Education Committee if 2 (two) members are present
- 28.5** Minutes shall be drafted on the decisions by the Education Committee, to be signed by the person responsible for the minutes and the chairman of the meeting and served on all Education Committee members, the Executive Committee, the chairmen of the committees, the Supervisory Organ and the active members no later than 60 (sixty) days from the vote. Art. 22.6 applies analogously.

7. THE DEVELOPMENT AND MARKETING COMMITTEE

Art. 29: Composition

The Development and Marketing Committee is composed of:

- 29.1** The Media Manager (Chairman)
- 29.2** And another 3 (three) members who must not be members of the Executive Committee
- 29.3** The 4 (four) members of the Development and Marketing Committee are elected at the orderly Delegates' Assembly for a period of 2 (two) years. They must not belong with the same active members, but can be re-elected without restrictions.

Art. 30: Competences and tasks

- 30.1** Further development of minigolf sport through creation of future-oriented concepts.
- 30.2** The acquisition of new active members from European nations who aren't yet members of EMF.
- 30.3** The correspondence and support of clubs and sports organisations, who already are active members. The goal is to establish a national minigolfsport federation in these nations.
- 30.4** Finding sources of finance.
- 30.5** The Development and Marketing Committee convenes annually and is convened analogously to the Art. 14 through the Media Manager.
- 30.6** A quorum exists in the Development and Marketing Committee if 2 (two) members are present

- 30.7** Minutes shall be drafted on the decisions by the Development and Marketing Committee, to be signed by the person responsible for the minutes and the chairman of the meeting and served on all Development and Marketing Committee members, the Executive Committee, the chairmen of the committees, the Supervisory Organ and the active members no later than 60 (sixty) days from the vote. Art. 22.6 applies analogously.

8. THE LEGAL COMMITTEE

Art. 31: Composition, term of office, and election

- 31.1** The Legal Committee consists of a Chairman, 2 (two) members, and 2 (two) deputy members neither belonging to any other organ of the EMF or the WMF nor to the same active member.
- 31.2** The members of the Legal Committee are elected by the Delegates' Assembly for one term of office of 2 years and can be re-elected without restrictions.

Art. 32: Competences

- 32.1** The Legal Committee settles and decides all disputes between
- 32.1.1** the active members.
 - 32.1.2** active members and organs of the EMF.
 - 32.1.3** organs of the EMF.
- 32.2** The Legal Committee shall also have competence for imposing fines under the legal and penal order as well as for remedies against fines imposed by other organs of the EMF.

9. THE SUPERVISORY ORGAN

Art. 33: Composition, term of office, election

The Delegates' Assembly determines 3 (three) members of the active members as the Supervisory Organ for one term of office of 2 years.

Art. 34: Tasks

- 34.1** The members of the Supervisory Organ shall supervise the bookkeeping and the necessity of the EMF's expenses and annually provide an adequate report on the financial situation and the accounts to the Executive Committee and to the Delegates' Assembly. The report is to be signed by all the members of the Supervisory Organ. Insofar they perform the role of auditors.
- 34.2** They are at any time allowed to audit the accounts subject to a fourteen-day written notice to the Finance Manager and a simultaneous notification to the President of the EMF.
- 34.3** In addition to the audit of the accounts the members of the Supervisory Organ are also responsible for the continuous control of the EMF management regarding its compliance with the statutes. The enquiries of Supervisory Organ to any elected person or organ are to be answered substantially. The access to all files is to be guaranteed if demanded. Also these procedures must be reported in writing and the report to be submitted to the Executive Committee and the Delegates' assembly.
- 34.4** Members of the Supervisory Organ are neither allowed to be members in any other organs of EMF or WMF nor belonging to the same active member than another member of the Supervisory Organ.

Part 4: FINAL PROVISIONS

Art. 35: Amendments to the statutes

Amendments to the statutes can only be decided by the Delegates' Assembly. This requires a majority of the delegates entitled to vote.

Art. 36: Dissolution of the Federation

- 36.1** The EMF can be dissolved:
- 36.1.1** through a merger with other non-profit international sport federations.
 - 36.1.2** through liquidation.
- 36.2** The dissolution of the federation can only be decided at a specifically called extraordinary Delegates' Assembly. A 3/4 - majority of the votes by the delegates entitled to vote is required for this purpose.

36.3 Unless other people have been commissioned by virtue of a decision by the Delegates' Assembly the Federation shall be dissolved by two members of the Executive Committee, who are authorized to represent EMF.

36.4 In the event of a merger the Federation's existing assets are contributed to the merging federation. In the event of a liquidation of the federation these assets are contributed to the International Olympic Committee; CH-1007 Lausanne / Switzerland, to be used directly and exclusively for charitable purposes for Minigolfsport.

Art. 37: Official language:

37.1 The official language of the EMF is English.

Art. 38: Entry into force

38.1 These statutes shall enter into force when the federation is registered in the association registry.

2. Signatures

This document shall whenever changed be signed by the 7 biggest of its founding Members. This signature is done after the decided changes done by the delegate conference in Timisoara (ROM), 22nd August 2004.

Changes in this document have been made after the extra delegates conference in Steyer (AUS), 22nd of August 2005.
